





Introduction to Cook Counselor for Graduate Students

United Feminist Movement & GSA Collab

- 1. Expel students found guilty of rape.
- 2. Human Resources must enforce the mandatory Title IX training for employees, rather than leaving responsibility to individual supervisor discretion.
- VTPD must provide more timely warnings of sexual violence on campus, specifically monthly summaries when indvidual cases are unable to be disclosed.
- 4. Title IX information must be added to the University communications plan, in order for students to directly receive information from the Title IX office.
- The University must also make students aware of all Title IX committees, working groups and advisories and provide regular updates on their progress.
- 6. An external, independent investigation of the Title IX process must be made.
- 7. Add BIPOC counselors and staff at the Women's Center, in ratios representative of the student body (as of now, all staff are white)
- 8. An online portal should be made available to students to allow them to check the status of their Title IX case.
- 9. The University must publicly respond to all relevant petitions regarding sexual violence on campus.
 - This is a draft of demands to the university by UFM
 - They are wishing for GSA to sign on to the demands upon finalization

Climate Action

 Resolution needs to be voted on By Oct 1. Sent to delegates by email and Slack.

 Jack Leff (GSA Delegate) was one of the authors and will field questions.

Advocacy Initiatives (External to GSA)

- Graduate Student Compensation
 - Charge: evaluate graduate student compensation at VT, better health/dental insurance, etc.
- Student Services
 - Charge: increased access to mental health, wellness, career services, etc.
- Diversity
 - Charge: make recommendations to improve hiring, recruitment, retention, and graduation status of URM
- Capital Planning Projects
 - Charge: dedicated 'affordable' graduate apartments and parking services
- Going Green
 - Charge: Make recommendations to the university to be carbon neutral, energy savings, etc by 20XX

Timeline for External Initiatives

 Today: form a GSA Taskforce for each initiative. 5 delegates volunteer to chair each Taskforce

 Oct 1: Present questions that will be used to gather data from the graduate school and other sources at VT

 Nov 5: Present data, provide recommendations that will be shared in multiple settings at the university.

Diversity Task Force Update

- 1. Discrimination/Experience (climate survey or exit survey data)
- Stipend differences (I have access to this type of data and it could be summarized)
- 3. International student experience yes this is a variable we have access to, international students are their own group within race/ethnicity, but we do also have their country of residence. What specifically are you looking for?
- 4. Degree completion/Retention this data is on the By the Numbers page I shared
- 5. Job placement the only data we have are from the Exit Survey.

I cannot give you detail level student data and I do not have time to conduct any quantitative analysis to really answer your questions. However, if you have someone with experience in quantitative tests such as chi-square/t-tests I can help set up the data in a way that I can share it with you. Did you have a plan for how you wanted to analyze the data/determine if any differences between these groups are significant?

Advocacy Initiatives (Internal to GSA)

- Taskforce to Overhaul the Constitution (Internal Affairs/Judicial)
 - Charge: re-write this, make it make more sense. Analyze the function of delegates and the executive board
 - *Organization name change may occur* to GPSA or GPSS
- Taskforce to implement a Graduate Funding Council (Finance)
 - Charge: Rules and regulations that guide disbursement of student activity fees paid by graduate students to graduate students.
 - 3 main funding items: travel conferences, outreach, small food items (departmental gatherings)
 - Verbal promise that this will go into effect Jan 2021.

Advocacy Summary

- 3 Standing Committees (join 1)
- 7 different task forces
 - 2-3 delegates/students (minimum) should be apart of each
 - 1 delegate should chair each task force, keep documentation, records, etc.
