# GSA 2020-21-2R (Election Day Holiday)



Resolution requesting Election Day be a university holiday

#### Registrar:

- Number of days in the fall semester Virginia Tech using the Carnegie Credit Hour definition to determine the amount of contact hours needed per credit. Currently the fall semester is already a day shorter than the Spring so reducing it further would be problematic.
- Impact on lab science the largest disruption to instruction caused by non-class days is related to labs. Lab
  experiments are typically set up weekly and any non-class day causes disruption to this schedule. Lab
  Science departments have, in the past, strongly voiced their opposition to adding non-class days to any term.
- Any adjustment to the calendar would require a change to current policy.
- Needs to receive approval from Academic Support Committee (reports to CUSP)
