

Graduate SBB (GSBB) Update-Pilot Plan 2021




- Pilot (Phase 1) Grad SBB starts March 1, 2021. Items fundable through Aug 1, 2021
- Will only fund orgs with 'graduate' in their name (during phase 1)
- GSA Finance will establish the structure of the board and get training to allocate funds and draft policy (CSA will need to approve of policy in Feb.
- Will reconvene during Summer 2021 to reevaluate policy & procedure for pilot Phase 2 to take place 2021-2022 academic year

Overall Perception of GSBB?






Answer	%
Much better	30.00%
Somewhat better	28.57%
About the same	31.43%
Somewhat worse	8.57%
Much worse	1.43%

59% said somewhat better or much better and 31% said about the same. Very few said somewhat worse or much worse

If you are or have been part of a student organization, which of the following categories does/did your club spend the most money?


Top 4 Categories expense:


Food- 28%

GSA Constitutional Overhaul

Problems

- No easy way for an individual to figure out where to bring issues
- Little or no communication with other branches (e.g. Roanoke, etc.)
- Exec board has too much work loaded on them
 - Makes it hard to get anything meaningful done policy-wise
- Transitions from year to year aren't smooth with transfer of information
- The documents, as written, are unapproachable

Mission statement



"The mission of the Graduate Senate is to serve as the unified, collective voice of all graduate students and graduate employees, advocating for our needs among university decision-makers and through university systems; create a vibrant community rooted in a culture of inclusivity and support; ensure access to the resources necessary for scholarly and professional success for when we leave Virginia Tech; and foster a network of coalitions among all graduate departments, programs, and groups to help us achieve these goals."

Mission statement (summary)



Four main goals of the assembly:

- Advocacy
 - Work with decision makers to address needs of the graduate student body
- *Movement building
 - Help guide departments in forming internal structure for advocacy
 - Use these to have more informed advocation
- Community building
 - Host large events to connect people, and to help with issue resolution
- Scholarly and Professional Development

- Tentative structural changes

 Restructure documents to be more approachable (to follow in
- Restructure documents to be more approachable (to follow in next slide)
- Add positions:
 - Advocacy oriented position
 - President Emeritus
 - Chief of Staff
- Construct cabinet to advise president
 - o Include people like representatives for Roanoke, post docs, etc.
- Move elections to December/January, so old members are around to help with a smooth and informative transition

New document structure



Split into three separate documents:

- Constitution
 - High level structure of the assembly
 - Long term goals of the assembly
- Bylaws
 - Specific rules and regulations pertaining to day-to-day goings on
- *Handbook
 - Does not have any legislative influence
 - Reference for position expectations (exec board as well as delegates)
 - Reference for standard assembly procedures
